The January 16, 2013 meeting was held at APT Research. APT Research provided pizza and drinks for the meeting. Roger Eidsaune, Vice President of the Huntsville Association for Technical Societies spoke to the group about the Huntsville Association of Technical Societies mission, organization and the activities of HATS. Seventeen members and 11 guest and guests attended. The TVC is a member of HATS. A breakfast meeting is being held with the member societies to define relevancy.

Mike presented Software System Safety, Software, Criticality, and Software Hazard Control Categories for Information Systems to 24 members and 6 non-members. Special Events Corner

The 2013 Alabama Regional **Future City Competition** (FCC) was held on January 19th in the University Center Exhibit Hall on the campus of the University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH). The competition allows 7th and 8th graders, in 3 person teams, to create a city under the guidance of a teacher and engineering mentor. All cities must address pollution, crime, safety, traffic, unemployment, power consumption, taxes, commercial and residential zoning, water systems, airports, and other social dilemmas. The Tennessee Valley Chapter was a Special Award Sponsor for the 2013 FCC. The TVC's Phil Eder and Steve Applebaum judged for the best use of System Safety in the city design.

For the ninth consecutive year, the Tennessee Valley Chapter sponsored three age group awards for the best safety-related projects at the North Alabama Regional **Science and Engineering Fair** held March 6-8 at the University of Alabama Huntsville. The awards were given in the elementary (5th grade), junior (6th-8th grade), and senior (9th-12th grade) divisions. The projects are evaluated on how the project relates to safety (40%), display (20%), write-up (20%), and discussion with judges (20%). John Frost and Bill Pottratz of the TVC served as judges. Samuel Schlenker of Columbia Elementary School won the Elementary Division safety award for his project, "What Material is Best for a Parachute". Samuel tested different materials to determine which would work best for a parachute. In the Junior Division, Andrew Miller of Westminster Christian Academy won for "Hang Up or Bang Up". Andrew's used a driving simulation program to test the degradation in driving performance while using a cell phone. Finally, the Senior Division winner was Joseph Michael Hinely of Covenant Christian Academy for "Text Safety". In his project Joseph detailed the development and testing of an iPhone App to disable the iPhone texting function while a car is in motion.

On Thursday, March 7, 2013, Chapter Vice President, Don Swallom spoke at the **Huntsville Association for Technical Societies (HATS)** relevancy breakfast at Dynetics. He shared how the chapter has endeavored to stay relevant by our efforts to reach out to youth through the North Alabama Regional Science and Engineering Fair, the Future City Competition, and the NASA Great Moonbuggy Race, as well as our efforts to diversify the themes of our meetings to meet the needs of our members and potential members.

Upcoming Events

This year, the Tennessee Valley Chapter will once again be judging for the best use of system safety in "*The System Safety Challenge*" at the **2013 Great Moonbuggy Race** to be held April 25-27, 2013. Two teams, one college and one high school, will be recognized for the best application of System Safety Engineering.
